Feasts this week

Monday	Saints Joachim and Anne, Parents of the Blessed Virgin Mary – It was in the home of her parents that Mary received her training to be the Mother of God.
Tuesday	Blessed Robert Sutton, Priest and Martyr of the Reformation. He and his two brothers became Priests. He was arrested in Stafford for being a Priest and executed in 1588.
Thursday	St Martha, our Lord liked the home of Martha, her brother Lazarus and her sister Mary in Bethany, and as friends they took loving care of him.
Friday	St Peter Chrysologus, was Archbishop of Ravenna and became known as "the man of golden speech "for his eloquent sermons, of which some two hundred remain.
Saturday	St Ignatius of Loyola, was a Spanish Basque soldier who became a priest and theologian, founding the religious order called the Society of Jesus or Jesuits.

B30 Foodbank - Last week we gave out 1,360kgs of food, 1,232kgs to 101 people and 159kgs to other foodbanks. Urgently needed: Instant coffee (not decaf), tinned fish (not tuna), sugar 500g size, snack bars, potato smash, gender neutral shampoo, roll-on deodorant, disposable razors, strong carrier bags.

Covid - Going Forward

The following are recommended that we should continue

- 1. Sanitising hands on entry and leaving church.
- 2. Wear face coverings to reduce aerosol or droplet spread.
- 3. Keeping at least one metre between our group and others
- 4. Ventilating buildings well (especially during and between Masses).
- 5. Regular cleaning using usual cleaning detergents, especially high frequency touch points
- 6. Clearing spillages of body fluids according to guidance.
- 7. Cleaning thoroughly if anyone who has been into church in the last 24 hours tests positive.

There are no longer restrictions on weddings, funerals or baptisms, but only one baptism at any one time.

Communal singing may begin, but we should wear masks whilst singing.

Confessionals can re-open subject to placing a barrier between priest and penitent and cleaning after use.
