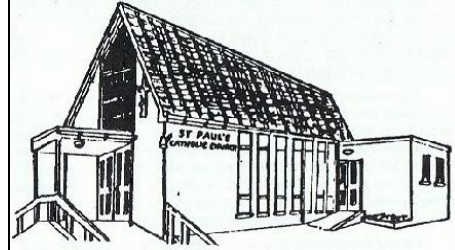

Feasts this week

Monday	St Stephen of Hungary was the first King of Hungary and he led his country to embrace the Christian faith.
Thursday	Saint John Eudes was a French Roman Catholic priest who founded two religious orders and encouraged devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus.
Friday	St. Bernard founded Clairveaux Abbey in France. He wrote many works on the Virgin Mary and Jesus Christ, as well as other works of theology and asceticism.
Saturday	St Pius X was Pope from 1903 to 1914. He lowered to seven the age at which children made their First Holy Communion and so is the patron saint of first communicants.

QE Hospital – Currently there is not a full time Priest. Please make sure that your hospital registration details include that you are a Catholic. Do not wait until a point of crisis before you ask for a Priest and ask Father Barry for the Sacrament of the Sick if you know you are going into Hospital for major surgery.

Cotteridge Quakers - have established a Community Fund 'to provide grants for projects and initiatives which improve the environment and social community of Cotteridge'. Eligible groups including PTAs, schools, charities etc. e.g. street parties, toddler groups and social events.

B30 Foodbank - Last week we received in 1,323kgs of food from street collections and gave out 1,619kgs of food to 98 people. Urgently needed, instant coffee (not decaf), sugar 500g, potato smash, UHT semi skimmed milk, gender neutral shampoo, disposable razors, toilet rolls, washing up liquid (small).

Sanctuary Project – need: soup, tinned veg, baked beans, tomatoes, kidney beans fruit and cereal. toiletries - soap, handwash, nappies size 5 and 6. Empty 500ml plastic bottles to fill with oil. school backpacks and black school shoes in all sizes

Aid to the Church in Need – are highlighting the work of the Marist Brothers 'Bread for the Hungry' project in Aleppo – Syria. Every morning, hot meals are cooked and taken round to the elderly along with a piece of bread and fresh fruit and salad for lunch.
