Monday	St Rose of Lima, known for her prayer and care of the poor, is the first saint of the Americas.		
	St. John Wall - he served as a Priest from 1656 to1679 when he was arrested and martyred.		
Tuesday	St. Bartholomew - one of the twelve apostles from Cana in Galilee. He was brought to Jesus		
-	by his friend, Philip. According to tradition, he preached the Gospel in Arabia and Armenia.		
Wednesday	St Louis, King of France; lived a life of prayer and penance and died on the second crusade		
	St Joseph Calasanz, a Spanish Priest set up a mission to care for poor children in Rome		
Thursday	Blessed Dominic Barberi, he worked tirelessly for the conversion of England enduring much opposition. In October 1845 he received John Henry Newman into the Church at Littlemore.		
Friday	St. Monica was the Mother of St. Augustine, she prayed and suffered for the conversion of her son. She is an example of a mother with great faith in prayer.		
Saturday	St Augustine, converted at the age of thirty three in Milan, he returned to Africa and was elected Bishop of Hippo. There he wrote many influential books.

Do not wait until a point of crisis before you ask for a Priest and ask Father Barry for the Sacrament of the Sick if you know you are going into Hospital for major surgery.

<u>B30 Foodbank</u> - Last week we received in 1,120kgs of food in donations and gave out 1,396kgs of food to 95 people. Urgently needed, instant coffee (not decaf), sugar 500g, potato smash gender neutral shampoo, disposable razors, strong carrier bags, toilet rolls, washing up liquid (not family sized bottles)
