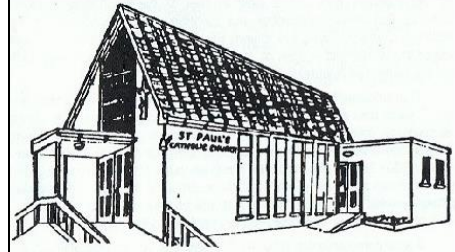

Feasts this week

Monday	St Vincent de Paul, was a priest who dedicated himself to the evangelisation of the poor and the suffering. His life remained deeply rooted in humility despite his worldwide fame.
Tuesday	St Wenceslaus, was the King of Bohemia in the early 900s he was killed at the age of 24 on his way to Mass by his estranged brother's followers at what should have been a truce. St Lawrence Ruiz is the first Filipino to be canonised martyred at Nagasaki in 1637.
Wednesday	The feast of the Archangels: Michael fought against Satan; Gabriel brought the news of the births of John the Baptist, and Jesus; Raphael took care of Tobias on his journey.
Thursday	St Jerome, revised the Latin text of the Bible known as the vulgate and he wrote many commentaries on the books of the bible whilst living in Bethlehem.
Friday	St Theresa of the Child Jesus, outstanding for her humility, simplicity and confidence in God. She died in 1897. She is the patron saint of France and the missions.
Saturday	The Holy Guardian Angels everyone has one who watches over and helps them.
