

B30 Foodbank - Last week we received in donations 2,180kgs and gave out 1,524kgs feeding 133 people Urgently needed Sugar 500g, potato smash, jam/honey, porridge, cereal up to 500g, UHT whole milk, tinned tomatoes, tinned rice pudding, pack/pot noodles, liquid or bar soap and gender neutral shampoo.

<u>Prisoners' Sunday</u> - Pact the national Catholic charity which provides support to men, women and young people in prison and their children and families. Asks us to pray for a society in which justice is a process of restoration and healing, where the innate dignity of every human is valued.

<u>The Sanctuary Project</u> – remind us that this Sunday is World Mental Health Day and that refugees are five times more likely to have mental health needs than the rest of the UK population?
